



# Master Langues et sociétés

## Euroculture

### Présentation

Les parcours rassemblés dans la mention « Langues et sociétés » visent à former des diplômés qui seront en mesure de dégager, d'analyser et de traiter une problématique dans des champs professionnels divers touchant au domaine de l'interculturalité. La maîtrise avancée d'une ou plusieurs langues étrangères constitue un aspect commun fondamental pour l'ensemble des parcours. L'apprentissage des langues est conçu en fonction d'un objectif premier d'employabilité en contexte professionnel.

Les Masters Langues et sociétés se caractérisent, dans l'ensemble, par des liens très forts avec le monde socio-économique. Le raisonnement pédagogique part des compétences visées pour arriver à la conception du programme.

La logique de l'ensemble des parcours de la mention se traduit par différentes compétences visées communes :

- Travailler et communiquer à l'écrit et à l'oral en français et dans plusieurs langues (langues à grande et à moindre diffusion) dans des contextes variés ;
- Conceptualiser, poser une problématique, développer une argumentation et une pensée critique ;
- Savoir identifier et analyser des situations de contact, d'échanges et de transferts culturels et linguistiques ;
- Mettre en œuvre la méthodologie de la recherche documentaire ; comprendre et analyser les problématiques culturelles, sociétales et politiques en adoptant une démarche pluridisciplinaire ;
- Maîtriser les nouvelles technologies de l'information et de la communication multilingue de manière stratégique.

A ces compétences communes s'ajoutent pour chaque parcours des compétences spécifiques et clairement identifiées visant des compétences techniques et hautement professionnalisantes telles que, à titre d'exemple, savoir créer et animer des sites web multilingue ou savoir gérer un projet dans le domaine de la communication.

Selected by the European Commission as an Erasmus Mundus Programme of Excellence, Euroculture is a truly international MA programme. The Euroculture programme is a cooperation between eight European and four non-European universities. The Euroculture programme aims to prepare graduates for the increasing number of professions and research areas in which knowledge and understanding of contemporary Europe – its peoples, its processes, its institutions – is necessary.

The main objectives of the programme are:

- To give students a broad understanding of the functioning of European integration and an in-depth knowledge of the aspects of European integration that constitute the specialisms of their chosen universities.
- To teach students the research skills necessary to further their knowledge and carry out exercises of reflection and analysis.
- To equip students with the communication and intercultural skills necessary for working in an international environment
- To introduce students to professionals working in various fields of European integration so as to allow for a transfer of expertise and professional competences.
- To encourage students to construct a network of contacts of their own that will serve as a valuable asset in their professional careers.

The Euroculture Consortium offers a Joint Master Degree programme. Because of higher organizational costs as well as the additional services offered compared to regular Master programmes, Euroculture's tuition fee rate might be different from other programmes seen at your university of choice. However, Euroculture's tuition fee rate is still highly competitive compared to other similar prestigious European Master programmes, and your overall costs can be **reduced** through various funding schemes, such as the **tuition fee waiver and Erasmus+ mobility grants**. The following is always included in the tuition fees for Euroculture:

Required literature, accommodation, travel costs and fieldwork-related costs are NOT included in the above-mentioned tuition fees. **Health insurance** offered by the consortium is obligatory for students outside of the EU/EEA. For EU/EEA student with a European Health Insurance Card, the AON Insurance Package is not necessary. In case of questions, send an email to euroculture@rug.nl.

The Euroculture programme distinguishes two types of students, each with a different level of participation costs for the 2-year programme:

- students who **do** hold a passport from one of the European Union or EEA countries
- students who **do not** hold a passport from one of the European Union or EEA countries
- Erasmus Mundus scholarship holders (EU/EEA or otherwise) do not need to transfer tuition fees to the programme directly. For scholarship holders, the relevant tuition fee amount is already included in the grant amount, and will be subtracted automatically from their total scholarship.

EU/EEA passport holders:

- **€1575** per semester **with** the standard Consortium Waiver (**€6300** for the entire programme)
- **€2000** per semester **without** the standard Consortium Waiver (**€8000** for the entire programme)
- European nationals may opt for a two-year AON ICS Complete Health Insurance Policy of **€1000**, which can be included in their fees.

The Consortium Waiver reduces the overall applicable tuition fee by **€1700**. This waiver is automatically applied for all EU/EEA students, with the exception of those applicants receiving a full scholarship covering living costs from sources **other** than the Erasmus Mundus Scholarship.

Non-EU/EEA passport holders:

- **€4500** per semester, including **AON ICS Complete Health Insurance** (**€18.000** for the entire programme).

AON insurance is always included for non-EU/EEA applicants. Non-EU/EEA applicants may not apply for the Consortium Waiver.

## Droits de scolarité

### Tuition fees cohort 2025-2026

The Erasmus Mundus Master programme Euroculture distinguishes two types of students, each with a different level of participation costs for the 2-year programme: students who hold a passport from one of the European Union or EEA countries students who do not hold a passport from one of the European Union or EEA countries.

#### EU/EEA passport holders:

**€1575** per semester **with** the standard Consortium Waiver (**€6300** for the entire programme)

**€2000** per semester **without** the standard Consortium Waiver (**€8000** for the entire programme)

European nationals may opt for a two-year AON ICS Complete Health Insurance Policy of **€1000**, which can be included in their fees.

#### Non-EU/EEA passport holders:

**€4500** per semester, including **AON ICS Complete Health Insurance** (**€18.000** for the entire programme).

NOTE: All tuition fees, university administration and diploma costs are covered by the tuition fees for the 120 ECTS Master programme. Insurance is also included for the 2-year duration of the programme but EU students can decide not to take insurance via the consortium. Required literature, accommodation, travel costs and fieldwork-related costs are NOT included in the above-mentioned tuition fees.

The Consortium Waiver reduces the overall applicable tuition fee by **€1700**. This waiver is automatically applied for all EU/EEA students, with the exception of those applicants receiving a full scholarship covering living costs from sources **other** than the Erasmus Mundus Scholarship.

## Prérequis obligatoires

Only students who applied online through our online application tool, completed the 3 steps of the application process, received a final confirmation email (after the 3rd step) and uploaded all required documents (see below) will be assessed by the Consortium Admission Board after each deadline.

### A good and matching educational background

Candidates must have completed an academic Bachelor degree in a discipline of relevance to Euroculture. Erasmus Mundus scholarship applicants must upload a copy of their Bachelor's diploma by 1 December at the latest\*. Those applying as self-financing students can send their copy of their Bachelor's diploma after the application deadline by [email](#), but the Bachelor's degree has to be obtained by 1 September of the academic year when the applicant would like to start the programme.

Examples of a matching educational background :a degree in the Arts, Humanities or Social Sciences, such as: European studies, History, International Relations, Cultural studies, Literature, Sociology, Political Sciences, Anthropology, Philosophy, Communication and Media Studies, International/ European Law, Theology.

\* This means that if you would like to apply for a scholarship and start the program in autumn 2018, you have to hold your Bachelor degree by 1 December 2017.

### No missing documents

Only applications containing [all required uploads/documents](#) will be assessed.

A good command of the English language

All applicants must provide proof of English proficiency by submitting test results from any of the following: CAE/CPE, TOEFL or IELTS. The minimum test scores required to join the Euroculture Programme are:

- TOEFL Internet-Based minimum score: 93
- IELTS: No section below 6.5
- CAE or CPE – Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE), C1 or Cambridge Proficiency in English (CPE), C2

### Notes and exemptions:

- The **TOEFL iBT Special Home Edition Test** is considered valid for the purposes of enrolment. However, tests which provide an indicative score (such as IELTS Indicator) are not accepted.

Notes and exemptions:

- If your score is lower than the scores mentioned above, you will **not** be eligible for the programme.
- Any other English test than the TOEFL, CAE/CPE or IELTS is **not** considered as valid by the Euroculture Admission Board.
- Students from China are **required** to submit a **TOEFL iBT or IELTS test** (no CAE).
- If you meet any of the below requirements, you are **exempted** from the Language Test submission. However, you must **still** submit a proof that the exemption applies.
  1. Students who have studied at least one year full-time in a **fully English-taught** university programme in a country where English is (one of) the official language(s)

-Please upload a **Transcript of Records** or **Statement on Language of Instruction** confirming that English was the language of instruction during your studies. In case a transcript or diploma supplement is uploaded, you must make sure that this document **explicitly** mentions the language of instruction, or it may not be considered.

-If Uppsala is your first university of choice: please mail [euroculture@teol.uu.se](mailto:euroculture@teol.uu.se) to see if this exception applies to your country

2. Students who completed an entire Bachelor programme in English (duration: 3 years minimum).

- Please upload a **Transcript of Records** or **Statement on Language of Instruction** confirming that English was the language of instruction during your studies. In case a transcript or diploma supplement is uploaded, you must make sure that this document **explicitly** mentions the language of instruction, or it may not be considered.
- If Uppsala is your first university of choice: If you received your university degree in **Bangladesh** or **Pakistan**, the degree-awarding university must in addition be listed in the World Directory of Medical Schools for the English test exception to be valid.
